The meeting was called to order at 8:48 PM by President, Talbott Ingram who gave opening remarks.

This year our Executive Committee has been very busy getting the word out about the Comet Class developments of the new builder and new cockpit design, as well as the introduction of Mylar sails. The Executive Committee also attended a meeting at the office of Robert Peronne in Philadelphia to discuss this year's class activities. Some of the Executive Committee travelled to Denton, MD for a visit to Mathews Bros. to measure and inspect the new hull and the deck mold inserts. Present were Brad, Talbott, Lee, Wick, Andy Wood, Jim Ryan and representatives of Mathew Brothers.

Secretary/Treasurer - Reed Rogers

We currently have 111 paid members, up from 99. There is currently \$12,025 in the Comet account. The North Americans almost broke even, thanks to the concerted efforts of Joe and Tina Lauver.

VP of Information and Publicity - Tina Lauver

The new website is up and running with new information and most of the old site transferred. Scuttlebutt has been sent updates Photos need to be posted on Facebook. We don't have that much area to display them to advantage on the website.

VP for Class Development - Brad Meade

The molds for new boats are complete and the first boat is on the water.

Allowing different skippers in different venues to use the Mylar sails has proven to be a big draw.

There was a large turnout at the North Americans where many got a chance to see the sails and give them a try.

We also have a large turnout here at the Internationals

Class Measurer - Dick Harmon

No report at this time.

Bermuda Fleets - Gladwyn Lambert

Talbott has been working through Scott Fox and Rockal Evans regarding the activities in Bermuda and to get the proxy votes here in time to be counted. Rudy Bailey was asked to speak on the level of activity in the Comet Fleets on the island. Rudy said, "The fleets are doing well and are always looking for boats moment." Barbara Best asked, "How do you keep your young to buy. We have lots of talented kids who want to sail.

The three clubs race together about 12 times a season. There are currently 29 active boats with about 16 boats participating in a regatta every 3 weeks. The West End and the East End Clubs are very active. The Mid-Atlantic is more of a social club at the sailors interested in Comets?" Rudy responded, "They graduate

from Optimist and look for a boat they can afford when they are between 16 and 22. High tech boats are short lived and expensive. Snipes are too physical. Comets are a reasonable price and not too physical."

Old and New Business

- Brad Meade noted that Carl Chapman has 2 boats available in Houston, Texas.
- Rudy Bailey feels the Mylar sails need a boltrope on the mainsail foot. The loose foot would allow easing the outhaul to form a more spinnaker like sail.
- Elliott Oldak felt the top batten would control the sail camber.
- Talbott Ingram reminded him that he could order a sail with either length batten.
- Stephen Widdis stated that too many variable facets for a one design class may discourage new sailors.
- Talbott Ingram: This is still experimental; there will be some variation during the developmental stage.
- Richard Gruskos stated that some classes buy sails every 3 years to sort out their ongoing development.
- Mark Beaton contributed the fact that the hull has always remained the same but there have always been variations in the rigs and sails. There have been 8 stay rigs.
- Mike O'Brien feels a minimum weight should be set for the sailcloth to equalize Dacron and Mylar. His concern is that there will be a demand for lighter sails that will only last for a few races.
- Mark Beaton feels that this market isn't interested in that dynamic. The present sails are made way above the minimum so they hold their quality for years.
- Mike O'Brien still feels the amendment should be tabled until a weight is set.
- Bob Slook says pass the amendment and add the weight restriction if needed later.
- Robert Peronne suggested just allowing the Mylar with no other changes.
- John Costanzo added,"Rudy said juniors are getting in for the lower cost What problem does it address?
- Joe Lauver reminded us that a suit of sails is still inexpensive relative to other boats.
- Both Stephen & Mike say Mylar sails don't last that long. Perfect care and no sun is not realistic.
- Bob Slook's J24 sails are holding their shape well. When asked if he would take these used sails to a championship regatta he said he would with no hesitation.
- Mark Hess liked the "slug" on the clew. So much easier to rig by yourself.
- Stephen says college racing they had choice for a while as to whether to use the boltrope or just the slug. They used the slug in light air and the boltrope in heavier air to achieve a better shape.
