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### Comets Return to Northern Lake George Yacht Club

It's wasn't Haley's Comet, but it might well have been. These Comets also haven't been seen in these parts for many years. We're talking about the Comet Class of sailboats. In honor of the NLGYC's 75th birthday this summer, the Comets held their 2015 North American Championship here on Lake George on June 20 & 21.

Thirteen boats from as far away as the Chesapeake Bay converged on Hague, NY to vie for the coveted Princeton Bowl, a huge silver bowl trophy. Five races were held with close racing on a beautiful Lake George weekend. South winds of 6-11 mph created perfect conditions for Comet racing.

Boats arrived throughout the day on Friday, greeted by club members and old friends. Sailors were treated to a home-cooked spaghetti dinner (provided by Donna Wotton, playing double duty as our PRO for the weekend) and a friendly tub of beer. NLGYC is a friendly family-based sailing club with

a big old Adirondack “salt box” building for a clubhouse. Just beyond the small islands the lake opens to it’s widest point (3 miles wide), creating a big sailing basin surrounded by the beautiful Adirondack Mountains.

Saturday was a bright sunny day. The race committee waited for a short time for the prevailing south wind to fill before getting off three quick races before lunch. Talbott and Lee Ingram of Shrewsbury YC won the first race, with Kevin Buruchian and Danielle Dubois of Massapaug YC a close second. Buruchian/Dubois rallied to win the second race, and the Ingrams won the third race.

The wind freshened to 9-11 mph after lunch for two more great races. With more breeze, the race committee changed to a triangle-windward-leeward course for some fun reaching. Race 4 was won by Brad Meade and Leenie Costanzo of Shrewsbury with Peter and Marion Abell taking a chilly “swim” at the gybe mark.

In the final race of the day, Rick Dhein and Ricky Rottier came in hot from the right on the downwind finish and nearly caught the Ingrams, but had to settle for 2nd by a boat length. There was close racing all day with the entire first half of the fleet changing places in the standings in each race.

Saturday night was an evening of camaraderie for all the competitors at the local country club. Good food, good company, good times for all.

The weather wasn’t as cooperative on Sunday. True to the weather predictions, the lake was even beautiful as sheet of glass under gray skies and there was no racing. The five races on Saturday constituted the series. In the end consistency won the day and the Ingrams took home the Princeton Bowl.

Special thanks to NLGYC Past Commodore Peter Abell who began sailing Comets as a teen, and sailed in the top ranks of the class nationally for many years with his wife Marion. Peter and Marion were responsible for enticing the Comet Class back to Lake George for their Championship regatta and organizing the event for NLGYC. We hope to return to this fantastic venue again very soon.

## 1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2013-2016, the prescriptions of the United States Sailing Association, the by-laws and appendices of the Comet Class Yacht Racing Association (CCYRA) and the Sailing Instructions <http://www.sailing.org/documents/racingrules/index.php>. CCYRA rules also require anchor & line, paddle, and PFD's onboard all boats.

## 2. ADVERTISING

Advertising will be restricted to Category A as stated in ISAF Regulation 20.

## 3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

This event is open to CCYRA members who have paid their 2015 dues. Membership information can be found at <http://www.cometclass.com/membership.htm>. Eligible yachts may be entered by mailing (**post date no later than 07-Aug-2015**) the attached FULLY COMPLETED Official Entry Form and Waiver and Release of Liability Form to: Andy Wood, 226 Harbor Lane, Queenstown, MD 21658. Late entries may be given to an on-site registration official at MRYC during the registration time periods **with the additional late fee**. Call or e-mail Andy Wood for more registration information at 410-310-9374, [woodhaus226@gmail.com](mailto:woodhaus226@gmail.com). All checks are to be made payable to CCYRA.

## 4. ENTRY FEE

The CCYRA 2015 Comet International Championship Regatta entry fee is \$210 per boat plus a \$15 late fee if applicable. This fee includes the \$10 assessment for the Comet Class as required in the Comet Handbook. The registration fee provides for 3 days of racing (weather permitting), a simple continental breakfast and lunches on the water for skippers and crew Friday-Sunday. Dinner Friday night will be at the outside dock bar and Saturday night dinner will be in the main banquet hall of the Miles River Yacht Club. Also included with your entry fee is free use of the MRYC pool facilities. Regatta trophies/mugs will be awarded to top 5 finishes for skipper and crew. Checks are to be made payable to CCYRA and mailed to Andy Wood, 226 Harbor Lane, Queenstown, MD 21658. Mailing postmarked after 7-Aug-2015 must include the late fee.

## 5. SAIL MEASUREMENT & NUMBER

Each sail must display the number as submitted on the boat's entry form. During the registration period all sails may be subjected to measurement and checking for CCYRA Sail Tax Labels. *[If you need Sail Tax Labels, contact Dave Seifert (614) 457-3094.]*

## 6. BOAT WEIGHT VERIFICATION

During the Thursday evening check-in and registration period boats may be weighed at the owner's discretion if a scale is available to determine an official weight as observed by Dick Harmon, Brad Meade, or Talbott Ingram. Weights may then be recorded and sent to the Comet class as an official record.

## 8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available no later than 4:00 PM on August 20, 2015.

## 9. VENUE

### **Miles River Yacht Club**

The Miles River Yacht Club was organized in November, 1920. It was incorporated June 1921 and purchased its permanent location on Long Haul Creek in 1930. The Club has hosted many local meetings and events, and is considered by many as a community partner. MRYC's proud heritage includes supporting the Log Canoe Races, which has become a major attraction of the Chesapeake Bay. Through the development of both adult and junior sailing programs, MRYC has significantly expanded interest in the art of sailing.

### **Spectator Boats:**

If available, spectator boats may be provided by MRYC as available.

### **Launching and overnight boat storage**

A boat lift is available for launching and haul out as well as a boat ramp. Boats and trailers are to be left in the upper yard at the entrance of the Club overnight. Wash down facilities are available in the upper yard. During racing, trailers may be left in the lower yard near the Club House.



## 10. THE COURSE

The primary sailing course will be an Olympic and be located on the Miles River. A modified Olympic course may be used if conditions warrant.

## 11. SCORING

This event has seven (7) races scheduled, tentatively with three (3) to be sailed on Friday, three (3) on Saturday, and one (1) on Sunday. Three (3) races will constitute a series; if four (4) or more races are sailed, each yacht's poorest finish will be discarded. *[Sailing Instructions will be provided at the Registration Desk.]*

## 12. RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats.

## 13. REQUIRED SAFETY EQUIPMENT

U.S. competitors shall carry a U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) approved personal floatation device (PFD). Competitors from outside the U.S. shall carry a PFD approved by their nations' certification authority to the extent permitted by international treaty. **CCYRA Specified:** All boats shall carry a paddle and a minimum 4lb anchor with 50 ft. line per CCYRA specifications, Section 16.

## 14. PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

14.1 No competitor shall use, either on or off the water: marijuana or any other controlled substance (as defined in 21 U.S. Code 802) the possession of which is unlawful under 21 U.S. Code 841. No competitor, member of the race committee, or member of the safety patrol shall use alcohol during racing. The consumption of alcohol by competitors under age 21 is strictly prohibited during the entire event.

14.2 An alleged breach of one of these regulations shall not be grounds for a protest. However, when the protest committee believes that a competitor may have breached one of these regulations, it shall follow the process described in racing rule 69.1 and a competitor found to have breached one of these regulations shall be excluded from the remaining races in the series, and where practical removed from the regatta venue and sent home. The competitor's boat shall be disqualified from all races of the series.
